

RESOLUTION FIGHT AGAINST THE DISCRIMINATION OF ROMA YOUTH

FOR ADOPTION

COUNCIL OF MEMBERS/EXTRAORDINARY GENERAL ASSEMBLY THESSALONIKI, GREECE, 21-24 NOVEMBER 2013

- The European Youth Forum has been advocating for the rights of young people in 1
- 2 Europe and supporting the creation of inclusive, open and tolerant societies. Among
- the Youth Forum's key values and principles are the active participation of young 3
- people, their involvement in decision-making, a cross-sectorial policy approach to 4
- youth supported by appropriate structures to represent them, and increasing mutual 5
- understanding of various groups of young people, regardless of their origins, 6
- ethnicity, beliefs, gender, sexual orientation, disabilities, or any other factor. 7
- In the light of these principles, the Youth Forum considers unacceptable any attempt 8
- to discriminate any group of young people, for any reason. The young Roma have 9
- been particularly affected by the recent economic crisis, serving as scapegoats in 10
- many European countries, as seen for instance in the Slovak city of Košice. 11
- Roma youth is a fast growing group, which in many European regions faces 12
- 13 obstacles to receive the same treatment and services as their peers. Struggling with
- language or cultural differences and challenged by the economic situation, it is at 14
- many occasions deprived of its rights and limited in opportunities. Modern societies in 15
- Europe, which should be defined not by their approaches towards the privileged 16
- 17 majorities, but rather their actions taken to open up for minorities, should not allow
- themselves to discriminate any groups. Therefore, the worrisome examples of 18
- discriminatory practices against Roma communities and the lack of actions that 19
- would prevent them and ensure equal opportunities for all Roma youth need to end. 20
- The recent attempts to segregate Roma population from the remaining part of the 21
- local community in Košice in Slovak Republic, to which European Commissioner 22
- Androulla Vassiliou reacted in her open letter addressed to the mayor of the town,1 23
- are simply unacceptable. Although, the reaction of the Commissioner tackled a 24
- particular case of the city of Košice, the example is neither uncommon nor 25
- characteristic only of that municipality. Considering the challenges faced by many 26
- members of the Roma community, the European Youth Forum would like to express 27
- its concerns and call for intensified actions of all stakeholders involved, in reach out 28
- to Roma youth and paying particular attention to the challenges they face. 29
- The Roma community has been at the centre of attention of many international 30
- organisations, such as the Council of Europe, the Organisation for Cooperation and 31
- Security in Europe, and the Open Society Foundations. Although, numerous attempts 32
- to increase the cooperation with and involvement in civil society organisations have 33
- taken place, the situation in the Roma community is not improving at a satisfactory 34

- pace. Policy solutions proposed by different stakeholders are not sufficient and their
- 2 implementation leaves a lot of space for improvement. The European Youth Forum
- 3 would like to express its foremost concern with this fact and commits itself to an
- 4 increased involvement to work on solving the challenges.

- Immediate actions taken by all actors on all levels to prevent any discriminatory practices against the Roma youth community, and reduce currently existing obstacles that Roma youth is facing;
- Particular focus on Roma youth that would ensure the construction of an inclusive society for current and future generations;
- Concrete actions by policy-makers focused on the whole scope in combating
 the underprivileged situation of Roma youth, by ensuring their full and
 appropriate access to education, both formal and non-formal, access to
 healthcare system, support in establishing and functioning of sustainable civil
 society organisations, further investments to improve the living conditions of
 Roma communities, and support for actions aimed at overcoming prejudices
 and fighting stereotypes;
- Enhanced efforts by the Youth Forum to include European Roma youth organisations in its activities and to include them in the membership of the platform;
- Commitment of the Youth Forum and its member organisations, in partnership with other stakeholders, to develop and strengthen already existing policy solutions directed at Roma youth;
- Increased attention of member organisations to reaching out to Roma youth and pro-active approaches aimed at including, wherever appropriate, local, regional or national Roma youth organisations in their structures.
