A EUROPE OF DEMOCRACY



e, young people, are not satisfied with politicians that only speak for those who will get them the most votes. It is our right to be heard. The days of politicians engaging with young people through solely tokenistic meetings and photographs are over.

We witness non-transparent and populist politicians refusing to take responsibility for their failures, and increasing hate speech in the media. We see a visionary Europe, but most do not: why is Europe incapable of communicating its success stories to its citizens?

We demand a Europe that puts the citizen at the centre of its decisions. We demand that barriers to running for election be removed, with women and young people just some of the groups most affected. Background, wealth and personal networks should not determine who can represent the people. We demand that political parties be made to be open and transparent about where they get their funding from, and how they spend their money. We demand that 16 year-olds be given the right to vote, and hope for a Europe where not just 0.5% of parliamentarians are under the age of 30.

We dream of a Europe where young people know the impact their vote can have, as well as the consequences of not voting. Their education ensures they develop the critical thinking skills needed to challenge populists and misinformation in the media, and to ensure their rights are upheld.

Our Europe is based on a coherent democratic structure that embraces subsidiarity and allows everyone's voice to be heard, while ensuring that decisions are taken at the most appropriate level, from local to European. It embraces and values young people's creativity and is reactive to large citizen-led movements and protests. It innovates and is open to new ways of including citizens in policy making.

We, young people, will engage with a politics that is innovative in how it includes citizens. We will get behind politicians who commit to meaningful dialogue with young people. Without including us, politicians cannot expect our generation's support. It is our right to be included, and we will take our seat at the table.

It is a place where we can hold hands with our same-sex partner in public without being afraid, and where nobody gets disapproving looks in the street because of the way they look or the clothes they wear.
