POLICY AND ADVOCACY

The overall goal for the policy development and advocacy of the European Youth Forum is:

- ~ to make the Youth Forum an AGENDA-SETTER in youth policy in Europe and beyond to fulfil its role as a responsible stakeholder, and advocate for the rights of young people.
- ~ to EMPOWER its member organisations
- ~ The Forum will do this by basing its policies on a RIGHTS-BASED APPROACH

YOUTH PARTICIPATION



~ CRITICAL SUCCESS FACTOR:

a strong European initiative to strengthen youth participation in decision-making processes at all levels, and inclusion of a chapter on intergenerational justice in the programmes of political parties.

~ WHAT WE ACHIEVED:

The League of Young Voters was established in 25 EU states and LoveYouthFuture gained support of 85 elected MEPs.

KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS:

~ EXPECTED RESULT:

Increased amount of young people voting with an informed choice at the next European Elections.

~ WHAT WE ACHIEVED:

the administrative and project funding support to youth organisations in Europe is ensured in Erasmus+ and continuing along the right track, the support to Member Organisations to help them to grow stronger is increasingly appreciated.

AUTONOMY AND INCLUSION

~ CRITICAL SUCCESS FACTOR: a strong European institutional initiative that will increase political and financial investment in youth employment.

~ WHAT WE ACHIEVED:

The European Commission released the Youth Employment package including policy measures and related funding (Youth Employment Initiative: Euro 6 billion) including a binding Youth Guarantee, a Quality Framework on Traineeships and the Alliance for Apprenticeships.

KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS:

~ EXPECTED RESULT:

Quality Education to be a priority of European Policies and a Non-Formal Education Quality Assurance Network contributing to this.

~ EXPECTED RESULT: Adoption of legal tools for youth rights in the Council of Europe and the UN system and re-launch of the Anti-Discrimination Directive campaign at EU level and advocate for the recognition of the Council of Europe Charter on Education for Democratic Citizenship and Human Rights Education.




WE SAID WE WOULD...

~ CRITICAL SUCCESS FACTOR:

strengthened inclusion of the Forum's members in its advocacy work and external representation, and increased pro-activeness of the members in contributing to the work of the platform.

~ WHAT WE ACHIEVED:

More and more inclusive working methods have been implemented through both online and face-to-face consultations, working groups and discussions at the COMEMs.

KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS:

~ EXPECTED RESULT:

establishment of working structures and tools that allow flexibility in the contribution to the processes of all interested members, as well as allow a more horizontal cooperation among members on topics of their interest.

WE SAID WE WOULD...

establish a platform, undertake surveys, establish virtual networks and consolidate online library. Online platform launched and **8** surveys undertaken. WE SAID WE WOULD...
undertake to visit MOs

Increase the quality of membership
services, of the Pool of Trainers and
Facilitators, and of the contact system

1988 individuals representing 82 MOs took part in 155 events, training sessions, and workshops: 84% of our membership has been actively involved in events.

~ EXPECTED RESULT:

A standard-setter as employer in the European NGO sector.

Update of the online recruitment platform; implementation of an internship framework in line with Belgian legislation; staff performances appraisal system; compliance of internal working regulations with Belgian labour law. 4947 applications received and 13 recruitment calls launched

~ EXPECTED RESULT:

A wider outreach and more resources for the platform and its members through partnerships with new actors, such as from the private sector, research institutes and think tanks.
